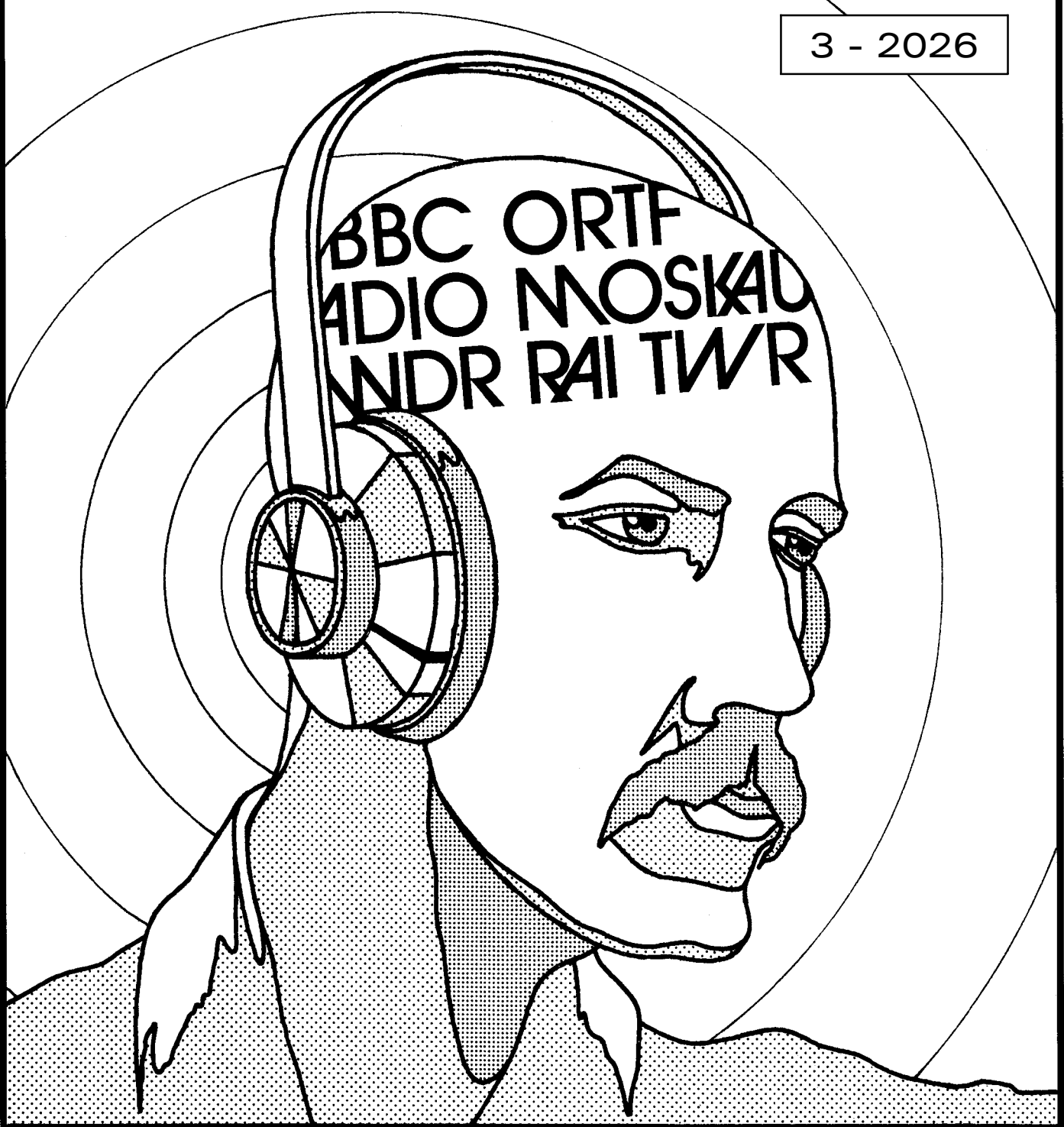

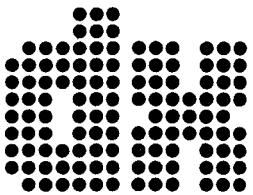

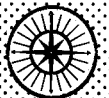

ARMENIA: 864 kHz non-directional antenna via Gavar-Yerevan high power bcst center.

"Due to internet outages and satellite disruptions, our news program will be broadcast in Iran from 8:00 PM Iranian time on medium wave / AM 864 kHz. Mediumwave can also be received on car radios. AM/MW band"

Radio Iran Azad was first heard in mid-January 2026. This transmission has been observed to come on at around 1615 UT with what is presumed to be filler music from the transmitter provider in Armenia, 'AR Radio Intercontinental', until time pips at 1630 UT and the opening announcement in Persian. This is followed by a news-based programme, including reports in English spoken over in Persian. The end of the broadcast appears to be information on using Starlink, with the same filler music taking it through to 1715 UT - when the transmitter goes off.

BULGARIA: (Cf. DXM 2/2026) **Radio Bulgaria's English Service: A legacy of distinguished voices**

Nine decades ago, in 1936, the first pilot broadcasts began from Radio Sofia, successor to the public Rodno Radio founded in 1930. Shortly afterwards, Radio Sofia started broadcasting to regions beyond Bulgaria. Today, these programmes are united under the name Radio Bulgaria – the international service of the Bulgarian National Radio. [...] The English service was launched soon after the first international broadcasts to Europe, North Africa and North America. Initially aired in Esperanto, the programmes later expanded to French, German, English and Italian. In its early years, foreign-language editions were produced by freelance contributors, including the distinguished broadcaster Petar Uvaliev, who prepared the Italian-language programmes, and the opera director Mihail Hadzhimishev, who presented English-language content. [...]

Many prominent figures in Bulgaria began part of their professional path in the English section.

Raina Konstantinova started in the English Service, responsible for correspondence with listeners. She later became

Director of Radio Bulgaria, Deputy Director of Bulgarian National Radio, and Director of the Radio Department at the European Broadcasting Union. On a previous anniversary she said: "Radio Bulgaria is not simply a part of the Bulgarian media; it is a unique institution with high standards of journalism. To me it is more than a workplace — it is a place where the world comes into touch with a genuine Bulgaria, with all its uniqueness and complexity. During the first decade of the 21st century radio became global, fulfilling the aspirations of many generations of broadcasters."

CNN anchor Ralitsa Vassileva was also part of the English section. She joined the service in 1987 as a translator and announcer before continuing her professional career at CNN International.

Long-time journalist Todor Tokin dedicated 15 years to the Central Information Service — Radio Bulgaria's reporting team - and to the English-language editorial office. "We had a very rich programme," he recalled. Alongside daily news and commentary, there was a weekly show, Top of Bulgarian Pops, presenting the ten most popular Bulgarian songs.

Among the professionals in the English-language team were distinguished figures from Bulgaria's music and film scene. Pop singer Theodore Shishmanov, founding member of Tonika SV, worked in the English section between 1985 and 1988. He joined the multilingual service with the encouragement of rock musician Georgi Minchev, who collaborated with the French section. Shishmanov served as an editor and contributed to music programmes, including a weekly pop chart and a monthly show presented by Minchev.

Djoko Rosic, the actor known for his distinctive voice, was part of the foreign-language programmes for 17 years. He later became a celebrated screen actor. In a 2002 interview, he reflected: "Only those with a perfect command of languages could do the job - and they were intellectuals. That is why many dissidents later emerged from Foreign Broadcasts. From today's perspective, one might say that we were producing propaganda for a party or a regime, but I am not ashamed of a single line I wrote during that period."

Radio Bulgaria's English broadcasts reach audiences worldwide. The editorial team covers news and current affairs, alongside programmes dedicated to Bulgaria's history, culture, tourism and contemporary life. Bulgarian folklore and contemporary music remain an integral part of the programming. [...]

9820 kHz **'Voice of Beibu Bay Radio'** - Nanning bc center site, at 12.20 UT, Vietnamese to SoEaAS target. Commentaries and occasional light pop music. Heavy QRM at equal strength with the co-channel CNR2 - Xian. // 5050 kHz also heard at good strength. Febr 14.

6100 kHz at around 23:00 UT - **Firedrake Music Jamming** again ?

FYI, once you've heard 'real' Firedrake / Firedragon jamming, increasingly rare, you'll recognize that its high-energy percussion, never vocals, is quite different than the regular Chinese music fill inhabiting 'Portuguese' and several other language services. 73, Glenn Hauser

So I've been hearing Chinese music on 6100 kHz for the past week or so around 2300UT and EIBI database frq request list says it's CRI but all I'm hearing is music playing so it could possibly be the firedrake jammer? It probably is because all I'm hearing is music and it's kind of strong.

17785 kHz on Fri, Febr 13, at 0220-0230 UT, **China National Radio 8**-Minorities Radio, Urumqi-Xinjiang province CHN, in Mongolian to mongolian-speaking areas of China. Man announcer talking; 0225 UT A music pause and woman / man communications. Poor reception: 25422.

CUBA: 11880 kHz **RHC La Habana** at 2000 UT on Febr 22. The best time to catch RHC in English here in NorthWestFlorida, at 2000-2100 UT. Always local level and the one transmitter which works almost flawlessly compared to the others.

The same transmitter is used for Spanish on 11760 kHz at equal excellent level until highly variable 1600-ish switch to 11880 kHz. Or sometimes, they don't bother to switch and stay on 11760kHz. Or sometimes, they never bother to come up on 11880 kHz, like this day. Maybe Millennial Miguel (who never got to learn "responsibility" from Prof. Arnaldo de Jesus Coro Antich) is on coffee breaks when this happens ?

EGYPT: Thanks for the information. According to the updated HFCC.odd database, they have made the following changes

Albanian 15:00-16:00 UT 9810 (ex 9490) kHz.

English 21:15-22:45 UT 9885 (ex 9440) kHz.

I think the reason for the amendments is so they can make full use of the one remaining operational transmitter. Following Turkish and Russian, it is now to be switched to the French and English services.

The noisy transmitter I was hearing on 9490 kHz, appeared on 9500 kHz from 15:00-16:00 UT yesterday. Maybe it is on test and under repair. I will be checking later on today to see if they make an appearance on the new channels. I've had no reply to any of my e-mail enquiries to RC.

FINLAND: (Cf. Radio Black Smith Knoll 6120 kHz in DXM2/2026) Kari Kallio posted the following about RBSK to the World of Radio IO Group on 21 February 2026: "Unfortunately, we have to share some technical news: all RBSK broadcasts are cancelled for now. In our setup we've been using a small battery-powered controller that lets us manually manage the transmitter power. After a long stretch of freezing weather, that controller has finally run out of battery, and the system can't be operated in its current state. We had planned to replace the battery during our spring maintenance window, but clearly we were a bit too optimistic about its real-world lifespan. Even though the battery is rated down to -20°C, prolonged cold conditions have a habit of winning anyway. We'll post an update as soon as we have a clearer plan for the fix and the timeline. RBSK will be back . later".

GERMANY: Budget cut weakens Germany's international broadcaster: Comprehensive plan to implement cuts adopted, Greek service discontinued.

Following the reduction in the federal subsidy for Deutsche Welle (DW) for 2026, the Broadcasting Council, the Administrative Board and the DW management team convened a special joint session to discuss a comprehensive package of measures to achieve the required savings of 21 million euros. Under the plan, the Greek service will be discontinued and the journalistic portfolio in other languages scaled back. The German-language journalistic offering will be merged with the German language courses. Numerous positions across the organization will be eliminated, and investment funds significantly reduced. In purely numerical terms, around 160 full-time positions are affected, although the final number may vary. There will be no layoffs.

Dr. Karl Jüsten, Broadcasting Council Chair: "DW must remain a strong voice for freedom, especially in restricted media markets such as Russia and Iran. To do that, it needs reliable, long-term funding. Due to the cuts, the broadcaster will have to expect significant losses in reach. This is particularly troubling, as Russia and China are investing heavily in their state-run propaganda outlets while the US withdrawal from international broadcasting is creating further gaps. By reducing funding to DW, both the German and European perspectives will be weakened internationally – and that at a time when Europe urgently needs new partners and allies. We especially regret the closing of the Greek service. For over 60 years, it strengthened German-Greek relations and made the German perspective visible in Greece. We did not take this decision lightly and it was not approved without dissenting voices. Unfortunately, the forced savings made this step unavoidable."

Dr. Achim Dercks, Administrative Board Chair: "The current budget cuts at DW come just two years after they implemented a savings package of 20 million euros. This is in direct contradiction to the pledge made by the government in its coalition agreement to strengthen DW. Without restoring its funding in the 2027 Federal Budget, rising costs across nearly all areas threaten to lead to long-term damage to journalistic quality, technical infrastructure and reach. It is only with adequate funding that Deutsche Welle will be able to successfully make its contribution to free reporting and against disinformation."

DW Director General Barbara Massing: "The savings made necessary by the cuts and the lack of compensation for collective wage increases are extremely painful. They weaken our competitiveness at a time when a strong German and European presence is becoming ever more important geopolitically. At the same time, we will continue to advance DW's quality initiative and digital transformation, launched several years ago – albeit at a slower pace. DW is widely regarded as a trusted and independent source of information, both in censored markets and in countries where Germany is building strategic partnerships. Sustainable funding for the future is crucial if we are to fulfill our journalistic mandate in a highly competitive global information space. Now is the time for the government and parliament to set the necessary course together. I am sincerely grateful to the members of the Broadcasting Council and the Administrative Board for their support, which was clearly evident during the meeting."

In the 2026 federal budget, the German government reduced its subsidy to DW by 10 million euros to 415 million euros. At the same time, the failure to offset moderate pay increases from the existing collective bargaining agreement will generate an additional 11 million euros in costs. As a result, DW is required to reduce spending by a total of 21 million euros. The savings will be implemented in a socially responsible manner and in accordance with DW's strategic priorities. Multiple areas of the organization will be affected.

DW language services

DW's Greek-language service will be discontinued. This service provided independent information to audiences in Greece, including during the military dictatorship. It served as an important channel of dialogue during the euro crisis, conveying German perspectives to the Greek public. Greece has long been a member of the European Union and is a stable democracy with a diverse media landscape, which is why DW must make cuts in this area.

DW's German-language offering will be restructured: The journalistic offering DW German and DW Learn German will be merged, with the budget nearly halved. Independent journalism and integrated language-learning elements will be combined into a clearly defined overall product focused primarily on learners at higher language levels (from B1/B2). The new format is aimed at audiences outside the DACH region – Germany, Austria and Switzerland – including learners in pre-integration programs abroad who are seeking reliable information about living and working in Germany and Europe. The service is designed to combine journalistic relevance with practical guidance while strengthening language skills. People who speak German well enough to follow current affairs coverage in the language can access established German-language media brands and publishers online.

Changes to the journalistic portfolio

The budget for the language services 'Portuguese for Africa' and Dari/Pashto for Afghanistan will be reduced. The number of editions of the Spanish-language TV news will be reduced, while prime-time broadcasts will remain unchanged. Several programs will be discontinued: the Russian-language satire magazine 'Zapovednik' (an external production), the arts and culture magazine 'Arts Unveiled', and the debate format 'Auf den Punkt' in all language editions. Also ending are the science magazine 'Tomorrow Today' in Portuguese (target country: Brazil), the environmental magazine 'Eco Africa' in Portuguese, and the Europe-focused magazine 'Europeo' in all seven language editions.

Infrastructure and Administration

More than one-third of the total savings will come from infrastructure and administrative areas, as well as from cost reductions achieved through the use of AI. Professional training programs and events are among the areas affected. Funding will also be cut for technical equipment, the further development of DW apps and building renovations. The expansion of new international correspondents' offices will be slowed. Costs in production and distribution will also be further reduced.

DW is Germany's international broadcaster. As an independent media outlet, we provide unbiased news and information in 32 languages around the world so that people can form their own opinions. DW's TV, online and radio services reach 337 million users every week.

DW Akademie trains journalists worldwide, supports the development of free media, and promotes the German language with free learning opportunities.

We were proud of the work done by the DWL staff at this era, such as of chief engineer Gustav.G. Thiele, ham radio call DL1ZK, Cologne, was father of DWL Kigali, Trincomalee, Sines, Malta and Montserrat Caribbean relay sites in this era; also DX Editor of DW transmissions in the sixties, etc., over these decades.

Now has been declined from 2010 season to 2026 season, a very limited service - worldwide-wise; on the web and few satellite channels since the major personnel and financial restrictions happened during the chancellor Merkel era. Limit declined yearly from 700 to 415 million EURs in the foreign ministry budget} of the global service in 2010 - broadcast stopped in German language, but replaced by English (!) world-wide service instead, managed on an 'narrow gauge' extremely left-wing ideological basis, without much qualified journalistic performance these days.

One tends to feel ashamed of this German foreign service product these days.

JAPAN: NHK begins 24-hour shortwave transmission in response to developments in Iran. In light of recent developments in the situation in Iran NHK has begun temporary shortwave transmissions of its Japanese-language international radio service, NHK World-JAPAN Radio, starting March 1.

Due to the attacks on Iran by the United States and Israel, there is limited access to information in Japanese. The service is meant to provide essential information to Japanese nationals staying in the area.

NHK normally broadcasts six hours of shortwave programming per day to the middle east. But in view of the current situation, the broadcast schedule has been expanded to provide continuous 24-hour service.

During the temporary transmission period, NHK will provide simultaneous broadcasts of NHK Radio 1, along with NHK WORLD-JAPAN's own Japanese-language international news and "Overseas Safety Information," which focuses on travel advisories issued by Japan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, including updates related to the situation in Iran. Because shortwave broadcasts can be transmitted directly from Japan, they are considered less susceptible to restrictions by local authorities.

NHK is providing 24-hour temporary shortwave transmissions of Japanese-language news and programming to the Middle East from the KDDI Yamata Transmitting Station in Koga City, Ibaraki Prefecture, and other relay sites.

LATVIA: In Latvia, amendments to the Law on Electronic Mass Media are being considered to provide for the broadcasting of radio programs exclusively in the Latvian language. The proposals include an amendment to Article

18 of the law, stipulating that licenses for broadcasting radio programs will henceforth be issued only for broadcasts in the Latvian language.

TAIWAN/USA: Radio Free Asia resumes broadcasts to China after Trump cuts forced near closure.

Radio Free Asia has resumed broadcasts to people in China, its chief executive said on Tuesday, after Trump administration cuts last year largely forced the US-funded outlet to cease operations.

For years, RFA and its sister outlets, including Voice of America (VOA), had been financed with funding approved by the US Congress and overseen by the US Agency for Global Media (USAGM).

Last year Kari Lake, a former news anchor appointed by Donald Trump as the acting chief executive of USAGM, terminated their grants, alleging waste of taxpayer money and anti-Trump bias. Critics decried the move, which led to mass layoffs, as ceding ground to China and other US adversaries.

However, Bay Fang, RFA's president and chief executive, wrote in a post on LinkedIn on Wednesday: "We are proud to have resumed broadcasting to audiences in China in Mandarin, Tibetan, and Uyghur, providing some of the world's only independent reporting on these regions in the local languages."

She said the ability to restart the broadcasts was "due to private contracting with transmission services". She did not provide details, but added that rebuilding the network would require consistent funding to be approved by Congress.

A bipartisan spending bill that Trump signed into law earlier in February included \$653m for USAGM, which oversees RFA, VOA and other government-funded outlets. That figure is down from the \$867m appropriated for the agency each of the past two years, but more than the \$153m Trump requested that Congress provide to shut down USAGM.

US lawmakers of both parties had said Trump's drive to dismantle the news outlets diminished Washington's clout globally at a time when Beijing is expanding its own sphere of influence.

Radio Free Asia partially resumes Uyghur language broadcast.

Uyghur activists have called on Radio Free Asia (RFA) to fully resume broadcasting to China's Uyghurs {in Xinjiang province, WB.}, after broadcasts recently restarted only partially, pro-Uyghur website Tamgaturk reported on 19

February.

"While welcoming the resumption of RFA's Uyghur, Mandarin and Tibetan broadcasts, the Uyghur Movement said the Uyghur Language Service in particular must be restored to its full former strength," it said. "The Uyghur Movement emphasised that RFA's mission is to provide independent and uncensored news was vital for oppressed communities," it added.

RFA had limited its broadcasts following a March 2025 executive order by US President Trump to cut funding for US state media. Mainstream Chinese media outlets had hailed that move as the "end of narrative hegemony".

UNITED KINGDOM: BBC launches emergency lifeline radio programme for Iran.

The BBC World Service has launched a temporary emergency lifeline radio programme for Iran in response to the ongoing turmoil in the country, and the unprecedented crackdown on protests.

To complement the existing BBC News Persian video and digital services, the radio programme will be available on mediumwave and shortwave across Iran to increase the population's access to news and information. To broaden its offer and availability of programming, the BBC World Service has also made some of its TV content available on mediumwave radio.

Since 8 January, the Iranian people have been subject to an internet blackout. Prior to this, BBC News Persian's digital services saw their biggest reach in a year with their platforms reaching more than 33 million people.

The short-term programme will cover the latest news and developments in Iran and will place events inside the country within their wider regional and international context. It will feature voices from inside Iran alongside clear, informed analysis of the most recent political, social, and economic developments shaping the situation in the country.

The live programme in Farsi will be available at 16:30 UTC on 702 kHz mediumwave and 9465 kHz shortwave. The programme will be repeated at 18:00 UTC on 702 kHz mediumwave and 5935 kHz shortwave.
The temporary programme has been granted resource from existing funds until the end of March 2026.

VATICAN STATE: Vatican Radio celebrates 95 years with new jingle

Marking the 95th anniversary of its founding, on February 12, 2026, Vatican Radio - Vatican News is renewing and relaunching one of the most recognizable elements of its identity: its jingle, the audio logo that has always accompanied the listeners of the Popes' Radio. [...]

The new jingle has been entrusted to Maestro Marcello Filotei of the Musical Programs editorial team, led by Maestro Pierluigi Morelli. It will accompany listeners throughout the entire day of February 12, before becoming a permanent feature of regular programming. The new audio logos are the natural modern evolution of the historic orchestration of *Christus Vincit* created by Maestro Alberico Vitalini - based on a theme by Czech composer Jan Kunc - a distinctive and recognizable element of the Radio's identity right from the beginning. The original *Christus Vincit* theme has been reworked in a modern key, maintaining a direct link with tradition while at the same time offering a new sonic guise in line with contemporary culture and sensibilities. [...]

The project includes four main jingles, all based on the *Christus Vincit* theme, each designed to accompany a different moment of the radio day: a version dedicated to awakening, one for the morning, one for the afternoon, and one for the night. In addition, there are two short jingles: the first uses the incipit of the theme, while the second reprises its ending, creating an immediate and recognizable connection with the original sonic branding. [...] An additional special jingle was also created by Maestro Pierluigi Morelli, recalling Baroque-era orchestration and evoking a historical and musical dimension that harmoniously fits into the tradition of Vatican Radio.

All the jingles will be broadcast simultaneously on the Italian-language channel and across Vatican Radio's 30 web radios, creating a wide-ranging shared listening experience. [...] The programming schedule will be as follows:

7:00–9:00 Wake-Up Ident

9:00–11:00 Morning Ident

12:00 Historical Ident - orchestration by Alberico Vitalini

14:00–18:00 Afternoon Ident

24:00 Historical Ident - orchestration by Alberico Vitalini

VIETNAM: Voice of Vietnam missing on shortwave?

The German-language editorial team at Voice of Vietnam <<https://vovworld.vn/de-DE.vov>> continues to broadcast according to the following schedule:

18:30-19:00 and 20:00-20:30 UTC on 9730 and 11885 kHz from TX centre Son Tay.

In January 2026, however, reception was so difficult that there were enquiries as to whether the broadcasts had been discontinued. In fact, however, the frequency 11885 kHz, which was barely audible or inaudible to the reporter, was received usefully across the Atlantic.

Thanks for sharing your observations on the German service of the Voice of Vietnam. You may be interested to learn that even in Germany some listeners asked whether the German service is still on the air.

(1) I listen to the station regularly and can report that reception of 11885 kHz was bad or non-existent at 1830 h throughout January 2026, while reception of 9730 kHz varied between barely audible and usable but not good or excellent. So, both frequencies are still in use.

(2) Concerning 9730 kHz China Radio International is indeed taking over the frequency for their musical, formerly Portuguese programme. Their silent carrier comes on the air at varying times before 1900 h, sometimes even when the German programme of the Voice of Vietnam is still running.

(3) With this question answered I have another mystery for you to be solved. Already in December, I noted a carillon breaking into the running German programme on 9730 kHz at 1835-1836. This carillon is also heard at the same time on 9770 kHz. I suppose it is a Chinese transmitter test because both frequencies are used by CRI after 1900 h and I have also heard Crash and Bang as a test loop recently.

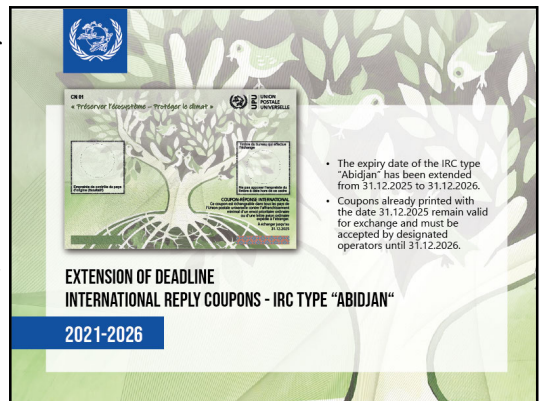

Since its introduction on 1 October 1907, the international reply coupon (IRC) has accompanied generations of correspondents, travellers and collectors across the world. Serving as a truly universal paper currency, it enables the holder to pay for postage of an unregistered international airmail letter between the UPU's 192 member countries. For almost 120 years and across 10 successive models, the IRC has embodied the values of universality, fairness and solidarity upon which the universal postal service is founded.



On 17 September 2025, at the 28th Universal Postal Congress in Dubai (United Arab Emirates), the UPU member countries decided, with a view to adapting and simplifying the universal services, to discontinue the IRC as of 31 December 2026. This decision is a natural progression within the broader transformation of international postal services, in alignment with the digital practices and modern outlook of their customers.

The UPU International Bureau is proud to provide support in this transition and is currently working towards the IRC's transformation into a part of the UPU's heritage, in keeping with its history and unique role in global postal cooperation. IRCs will remain valid and available for sale by and exchange with the designated operators of UPU member countries until 31 December 2026.

Lastly, in celebration of the exceptional legacy of the IRC, a special commemorative product will be released. Tracing the history of the IRC and offering an unprecedented customer experience, this product will honour this iconic page in the history of philately and the UPU.
