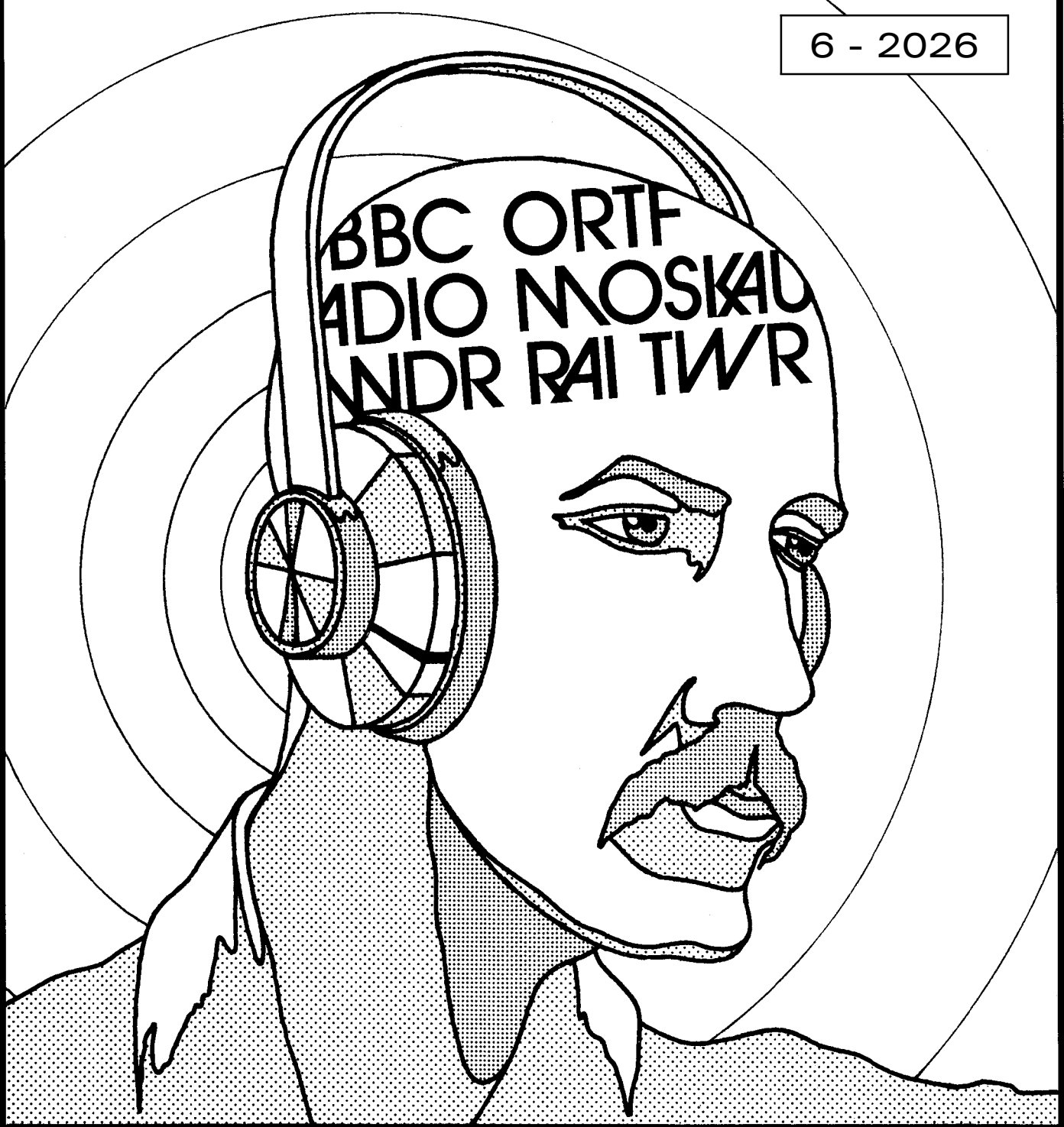

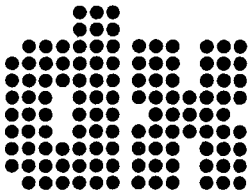

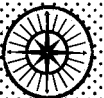

NEWS ABOUT BROADCASTING (+other) STATIONS

ALGERIA: 15140 kHz Ifrikya FM - via RTA Ouargla site, 07.20 UT, French to WestAF; political discussions. Good signal but spoilt by splash from CRI's Amoy service to SoEaAS on 15145 kHz. Runs // 17600 kHz via Bechar-ALG towards SoEastwards EaAF, where the signal was very good. May 8.

ANTARCTICA {Argentine sector}: Current status of Antarctic Station LRA36.
According to Zacharias Liangas-GRC, Argentina's Antarctic Division, Radio Nacional Arcangel San Gabriel's shortwave transmissions have recently been suspended due to a Collins transmitter failure. According to the station, repair work is ongoing and it hopes to revive 15476 kHz broadcasting in October 2026.

AUSTRALIA: Reach Beyond Australia on 11900 kHz.
Monitoring RBA today on 11900 kHz at 1325 UT I've noticed a variation in the schedule as shown across HFCC, Aoki, and EiBi. Most schedules have Kannada at 1315 UT, Hindi listed at 1330 UT and English at 1345 UT. This is not exactly true, even according to RBA's website.

RBA does list Hindi at 1330 UT and English at 1345 UT, but the 1330 UT block actually lists BOTH - Hindi and English as "- Fresh Hindi (hin)" and "-Fresh (eng)" and a regular English block at 1345 UT.

The English bit of 1330 UT kicked in at about 1335 UT. So, if you want to catch RBA, don't think you've not logged them if the language doesn't match.

BELGIUM: Belgian radio industry calls to keep terrestrial radio in vehicles across Europe.
The Belgian radio industry is calling on the European authorities to make FM and DAB+ radio receivers mandatory

in all new vehicles registered in the European Union, maRadio.be, RadioZ, La Craxx and Digitale Radio Vlaanderen stated in a joint press release on Thursday.

Faced with the emergence of new-generation vehicles without radio systems, organisations fear that "universal, free and non-discriminatory access to information" will no longer be guaranteed.

"By removing the FM/DAB+ receiver, manufacturers are threatening to turn free and direct access into a closed environment, monetised by the tech giants," warn Belgian radio stations, whilst 95% of in-car audio listening is devoted to radio, according to the latest CIM study.

BOTSWANA: re: VOA Botswana reportedly resuming SW transmissions.

Per reliable sources, the operation of Botswana relay site is just testing to maintain the equipment and there is not any scheduled programming being planned at this time.

Beginning 22 May 2026, new HFCC registrations have been made for USAGM Botswana (Moepeng Hill) for Tuesdays and Fridays, and these commenced on Friday 22 May with short music tests on the registered frequencies. Although the registrations indicate English, Glenn Hauser on the World of Radio IO Group commented "Per reliable sources, the operation of Botswana is just testing to maintain the equipment and there is not any scheduled programming being planned at this time". So no English to Africa is imminent and it would appear that any further tests, presumably on Tuesdays and Fridays, may not necessarily be for the full duration of times registered, just short periods of music.

CANADA: Canada's time signal station **CHU Ottawa** is to cease shortwave broadcasting in June 2026.

On 22 June, the National Research Council of Canada (NRC) will permanently cease shortwave broadcasting from its official time signal station CHU. From that day onwards, the familiar frequencies 3330 kHz, 7850 kHz and 14,670 kHz will remain silent. The NRC soberly points to modern alternatives for the future: the Network Time Protocol, or

NTP for short, for computers, web clocks and the traditional telephone service.

The history of CHU stretches back an astonishingly long way - to an era when radio itself was still in its infancy. It all began in 1923 under the aegis of the Dominion Observatory in Ottawa. The initial experimental broadcasts were transmitted under the call sign 9CC on the longwave band at 275 meters.

Anyone who has not yet sent a reception report to Ottawa should make use of the time remaining. The NRC has confirmed that valid reports will continue to be acknowledged with the traditional CHU QSL card. Fittingly, the card features an image of Sir Sandford Fleming - the Canadian railway engineer and "father of worldwide time zones".

For my work with modern SDRs - and specifically for their precise alignment for comparative purposes - the discontinuation of the calibrated frequency transmissions from Ottawa on 3330, 7850, and 14670 kHz represents a severe loss. Alongside the calibrated broadcasts from WWV / WWVH and RWM Moscow Taldom, CHU had served as a highly accurate reference source for decades.

CHINA: From mid-May 2026, the main Uyghur-language service **CNR13** had an additional frequency. This resulted in the following broadcasting schedule from Lingshi and, newly, Dongfang:

Previously, CNR13 could be reliably received in Europe on 9 MHz, particularly in the evening; now reception on 17 MHz is also possible during the day.

'**Yunnan Radio International**' on SW continues broadcasting, while YRI on 101.7 FM local transmission closes down. On May 28, Yunnan Radio and Television Station announced that Yunnan International Broadcasting's FM101.7 FM frequency in Kunming will cease transmission on May 30, 2026.

6035 kHz Yunnan Radio International, 1145+ UT, June 1, good reception via Khon Kaen, Thailand KSDR remote; best in USB, due to strong DRM on 6030kHz (China CNR1 Beijing site); in Chinese with announcers and some EZL music; 12.00 UT, multi-language IDs ("Yunnan Radio International"), continuing in Chinese with announcers and mostly airing EZL songs; 13.00 UT, multi-language IDs; introduction in Vietnamese and Chinese, then into the Vietnamese programming. So I believe this schedule then is still correct - Vietnamese 10.00-10.30 and 13.00-13.30 UT, otherwise in Chinese, as often observed in the past. I'm very pleased to find that YRI SW is still active!

Some short-term HFCC registrations appeared during May 2026 for **China National Radio** for services in Chinese, Kazakh, Tibetan and Uighur from transmitter sites at Dongfang, Fuzhou and Kunming. Most have now ended but details have been retained under the entry for China in Asia on Shortwave for future reference. The purpose of these broadcasts is not known.

COLOMBIA: A report that **Colmundo Radio** was closing its three MW transmitters and going off the air due to the decline in AM radio listening has been denied by the station: "Colmundo Radio is not shutting down, nor is it going off the air. We remain on the air via AM, with our programming active in Bogota [1040 kHz], and our stations in Medellin [1440 kHz] and Cartagena [620 kHz] operating as usual. Our digital evolution does not replace radio; it strengthens it.
 We embarked on this process years ago - without abandoning our traditional signal - in response to the demands of today's market. Internal changes are a natural part of media transformation, not a sign of closure. We encourage you to verify this information through our official channels. Disinformation is best combated with facts."

CUBA: 9790 kHz May 25 at 04.41-04.47+.UT, **RadioCuba** {Quivican San Felipe TITAN 250 kW transmission provider, WB.} demonstrates yet another way to screw up where something's always wrong: nonsense of about 11 syllables repeating over and over at the rate of 24 times per minute. Rough transcription: "tu oigo a vida victor op-se-chet", no doubt influenced by some real words in Portuguese or Spanish known to me.

S=9+30/40dB and gone at next check 05.32 UT. This is supposed to be CRI Cantonese relay at 04.00-05.00 UT, but unseems tonal. Often just dead air so this is an improvement.

CZECH REPUBLIC: Czech Television may lay off up to 500 employees after budget cut, Employees of Czech Television and Czech Radio protest against changes in funding, Union at the Government Office on strike alert over transfer of agendas.

If its budget were reduced by approximately one billion Czech crowns, as envisaged in the government's proposed legislation from next year, Czech Television (CT) would have to lay off between 300 and 500 employees. This was stated today at the Digimedia conference by deputy director-general Milan Fridrich. CT currently employs nearly 3,000 people and operates with a budget of 8.5 billion crowns.

According to Fridrich, in addition to mass layoffs and the associated severance costs, CT would also have to cancel major production projects already underway, including drama productions. This would lead to further expenses in the form of contractual penalties for terminating projects.

In 2028, the public broadcaster also faces the prospect of losing an additional 400 to 450 million crowns that it currently receives through an exemption allowing VAT deductions. This exemption is set to expire at the end of next year.

Hundreds of employees of Czech Television (CT) came today dressed in black in front of the main building at Kavci hory to express their protest against changes in the funding of public service media, which the governing coalition wants to push through. A protest also took place today in front of the headquarters of Czech Radio in Vinohrady. Staff from both media outlets also met in Brno and Ostrava.

Representatives of the Verejnopravne initiative, trade unions, and employees of CT and CRo had previously declared

an indefinite strike alert due to the planned changes. [...]

Czech energy giant CEZ takes first step towards full state ownership. Czech energy giant CEZ has won shareholder approval for a restructuring that many analysts see as the first step towards full nationalisation. By separating distribution and retail businesses from electricity generation, the company could raise billions of crowns for a future buyout of minority shareholders. The government says the move would help secure long-term investment in nuclear power and energy infrastructure.

Starting on 1st July, there will be major programme and time changes to our schedule. Our transmissions on 1467 kHz medium wave across Europe will increase with an hour each on Saturday and Sunday night at 22:00 UT (10pm Iceland, 11pm UK. Ireland and Portugal, Midnight across Europe except 1am in Ukraine, Finland, Greece and the Baltic countries). At the same time there will be a reduction in the number of programmes online although we will continue to stream 24/7 hrs/d.

GERMANY/UK: Tom Kamp, A-DX IO Group, reported the following on 13 May 2026 concerning Radio DARC: Contrary to expectations, the frequency change implemented on May 3rd by Radio DARC to 6070 kHz has led to significant reception problems in eastern and southern Germany. However, a marked improvement was observed in the west. To resolve the current issues, the editorial team has decided to temporarily switch back to 9670 kHz, writes Rainer Englert, DF2NU, in a statement. They are working on a better solution. "A transmission in the 41-meter band, around the frequency of 7380 kHz, is being considered. Based on current findings, this could represent a compromise to maintain stable reception under the given propagation conditions in both eastern and western Germany during the summer," Englert explains. "We ask for your understanding; we are working diligently to find the best solution". Europe on Shortwave (Germany and UK) has been updated to show this latest change. This SRF (Swiss Public Radio) podcast examines the intense language conflict and information war in Latvia, a small Baltic country with a large Russian-speaking minority.

Latvia has sharply restricted Russian-language content. The public broadcaster LSM shut down its popular Russian-language radio station 'Radio Four'. Russian-language education in schools has ended, Russian books face much higher taxes, and people with Russian passports must prove Latvian proficiency and pass security checks or leave the country. All this is justified as a matter of national security after Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

Court Ruling: Latvia's Constitutional Court ruled that the state broadcaster is not required to offer programs in Russian, emphasizing that the Latvian language is essential to the existence of the Latvian state.

Russian Propaganda: Russia and Belarus are actively targeting Latvian Russian-speakers. Radio Belarus is now broadcasting into Latvia (even in Latvian) with anti-Western, anti-EU messaging. Many Russian-speakers still consume Russian state media via VPN, YouTube, and apps, despite blocks.

Latvia's traumatic history of Soviet occupation, mass deportations to Siberia, and forced Russification (which reduced the ethnic Latvian population from 80% to 52%) fuels the current hardline policy. Many Latvians view the Russian language as a tool of potential future aggression ("Russki Mir").

Situation in Daugavpils: In the heavily Russian-speaking city near the Belarus border (contain nearly 80% Russian-speaking), tensions are high. The report highlights discrimination cases (e.g., hospital staff with Russian / Belarusian passports being fired from critical infrastructure), Russian disinformation campaigns, low trust in all media, and the challenge of winning over Russian-speaking hearts and minds.

Latvian officials and activists argue that without strong language protection, Latvian identity and democracy itself would disappear. Some Russian-speakers feel discriminated against, while younger generations show mixed identities - culturally Russian but politically oriented toward Europe.

The podcast portrays Latvia as a frontline state in a cultural and informational battle with Russia, where language is seen as both identity and a strategic weapon. It raises difficult questions about integration, security, minority rights, and whether strict language policies help or hinder national cohesion in the shadow of Russian aggression.

As previously announced Switzerland has reversed its planned nationwide FM shutdown. Following public broadcaster reach losses and parliamentary motions, FM broadcasting will now be extended past the end of 2026, with the switch-off postponed until at least 2031.

On 28 May 2026, the Swiss Federal Office of Communications (OFCOM) published the FM broadcasting frequency packages. Interested radio stations may submit an application for a broadcasting licence by 31 July 2026. If several radio stations apply for the same frequency, an auction will be held.

By setting out the framework conditions for future FM broadcasting, OFCOM is implementing Motion 25.3950, 'New tender for FM broadcasting licences from 1 January 2027', which was adopted by the Swiss Parliament in December 2025.

BBC World IP strategy failure.

Britain's willingness to bring the BBC's global service into the digital age didn't go to plan. A report from the British Public Accounts Commission says the BBC expected its listeners and viewers to go digital after the shutdown of its radio and TV services, but the other way around has happened. Instead of increasing, the Global Service's digital audience has fallen 11% to 131 million people since 2021.

Budget cuts have included the closure of BBC World Radio in 13 languages and BBC World TV in six, decisions that the BBC estimates have directly reduced its weekly audience by around 30 million people. The aim was to get many of these listeners and viewers to simply follow the BBC programmes online. This migration has not, to a large extent, been materialized. Some language services that moved to exclusively digital distribution saw a 63% drop in their total audience, while their digital reach also decreased by 39%.

The audiovisual company has not set specific goals for its multilingual services or followed the migration of audiences, previously dependent on traditional broadcasting platforms, to digital. "Without a shared vision of what ""looks good"" and up-to-date data, teams would not be able to re-orientate content and distribution quickly enough to engage an online audience," the committee wrote.

Despite a declining ratings, the BBC World Service remains a broad service, reaching an average of 313 million people a week in English and 42 other languages. The findings come as the BBC faces ongoing financial struggles. Global Service funding has decreased by 21% in real terms since 2021-2022, forcing the chain to cut costs while modernizing the service.

If the broadcaster fails to improve how it tracks audiences and manages the transition, the Internet switch could still weaken one of Britain's most influential international media operations, rather than ensuring its long-term sustainability, the committee warned.

VIETNAM: Changes at the Voice of Vietnam.

Seeking to avoid interference issues, the Voice of Vietnam tested new frequencies in the 9 MHz range in late March 2026 for its 16:00-21:57 UTC broadcast block directed toward Europe and the Middle East - specifically 9730, 9840, and 9835 kHz. Ultimately, as of April 1, the station reverted - at least - for the time being - to its familiar frequencies, including those for the German service, now on:

18:30-19:00 UTC: 9840, 11885 kHz

20:00-20:30 UTC: 9840, 11885 kHz

This applies to all broadcasts to Europe that were previously available on 9730 kHz.

The root cause of the issue was interference from ChinaRadio International (CRI) - interference that, however, did not affect the German broadcast. This situation was particularly vexing for the English & French editorial teams.

Hard-Core-DX (HCDX) WEBSITE WAS DOWN

The HCDX site was down for some time on May 13 and I asked Risto Kotalampi-CA-USA what has happened. He said that the site is currently under a massive DDoS attack. I am working to reduce the load to prevent the entire server from crashing, as we are being flooded by hundreds of thousands of different IP addresses. Filtering and blocking these individual IPs is putting a significant strain on the system. I have just turned the site back on, but I cannot guarantee it will remain stable while I continue to work on further mitigation strategies.

A Distributed Denial-of-Service (DDoS) attack is a malicious attempt to disrupt a server, service, or network by overwhelming it with a flood of Internet traffic, often using a botnet of compromised devices. These attacks make online services unavailable to legitimate users, causing downtime for websites, applications, and networks.
