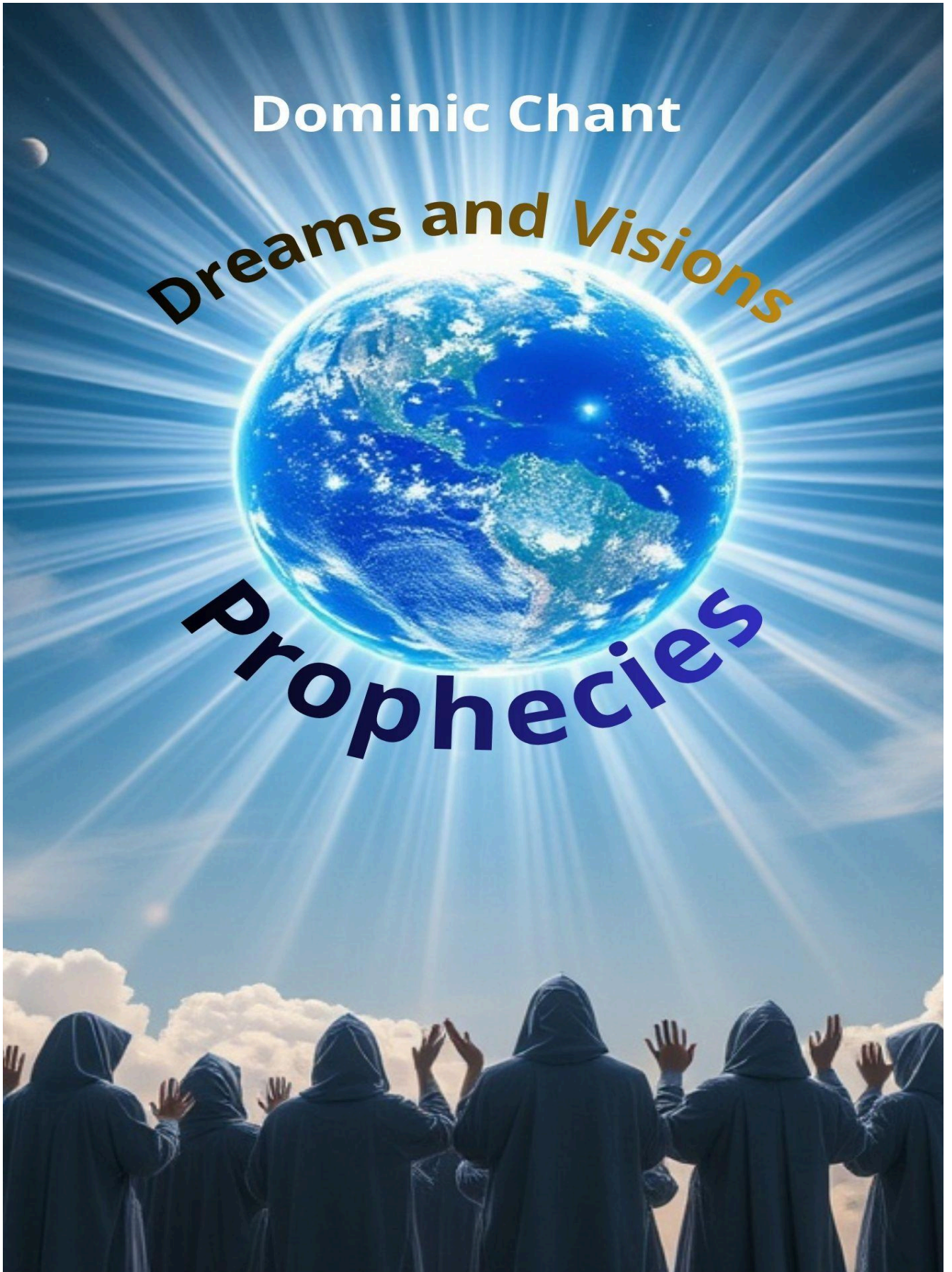

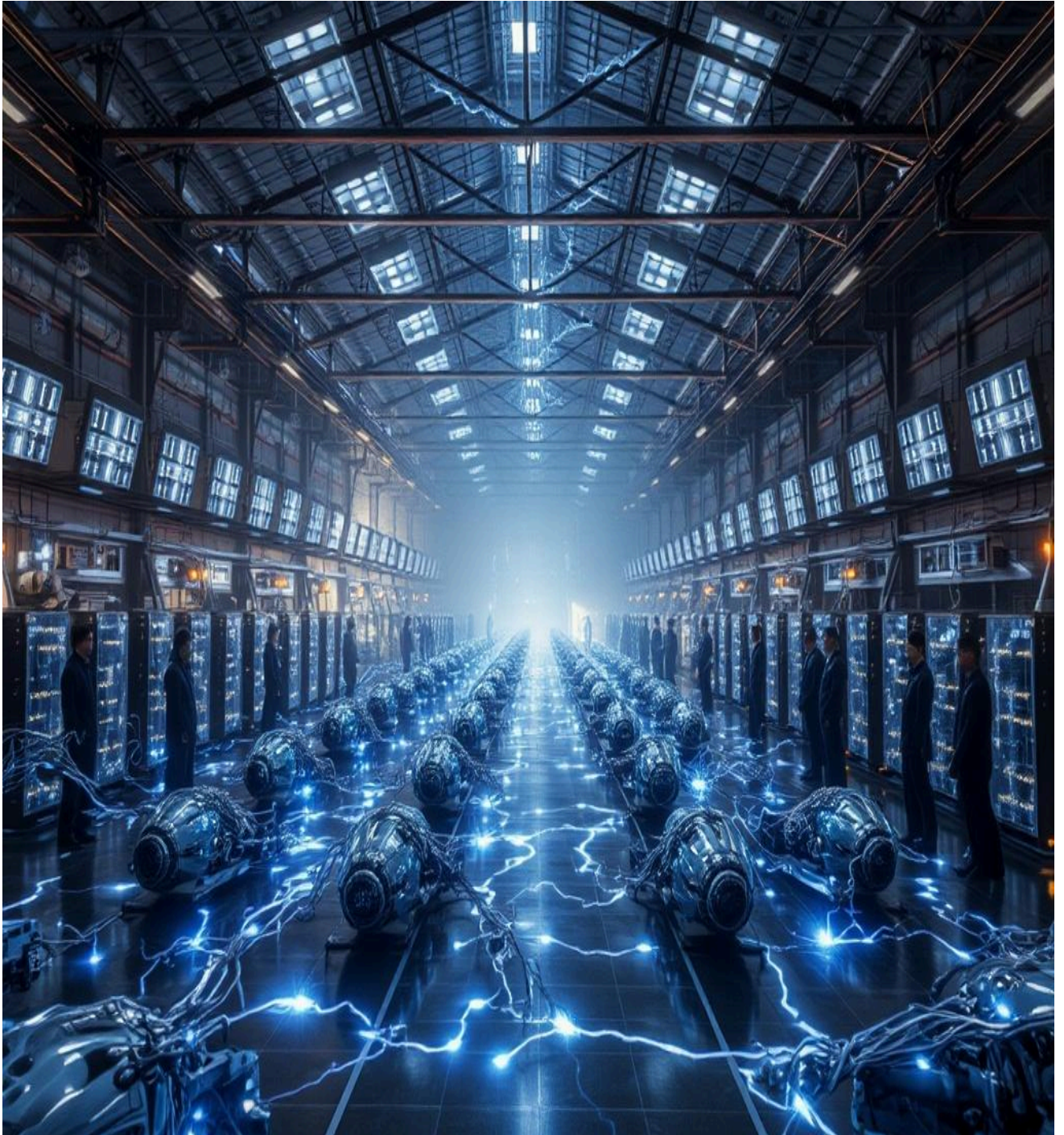
Synthesis

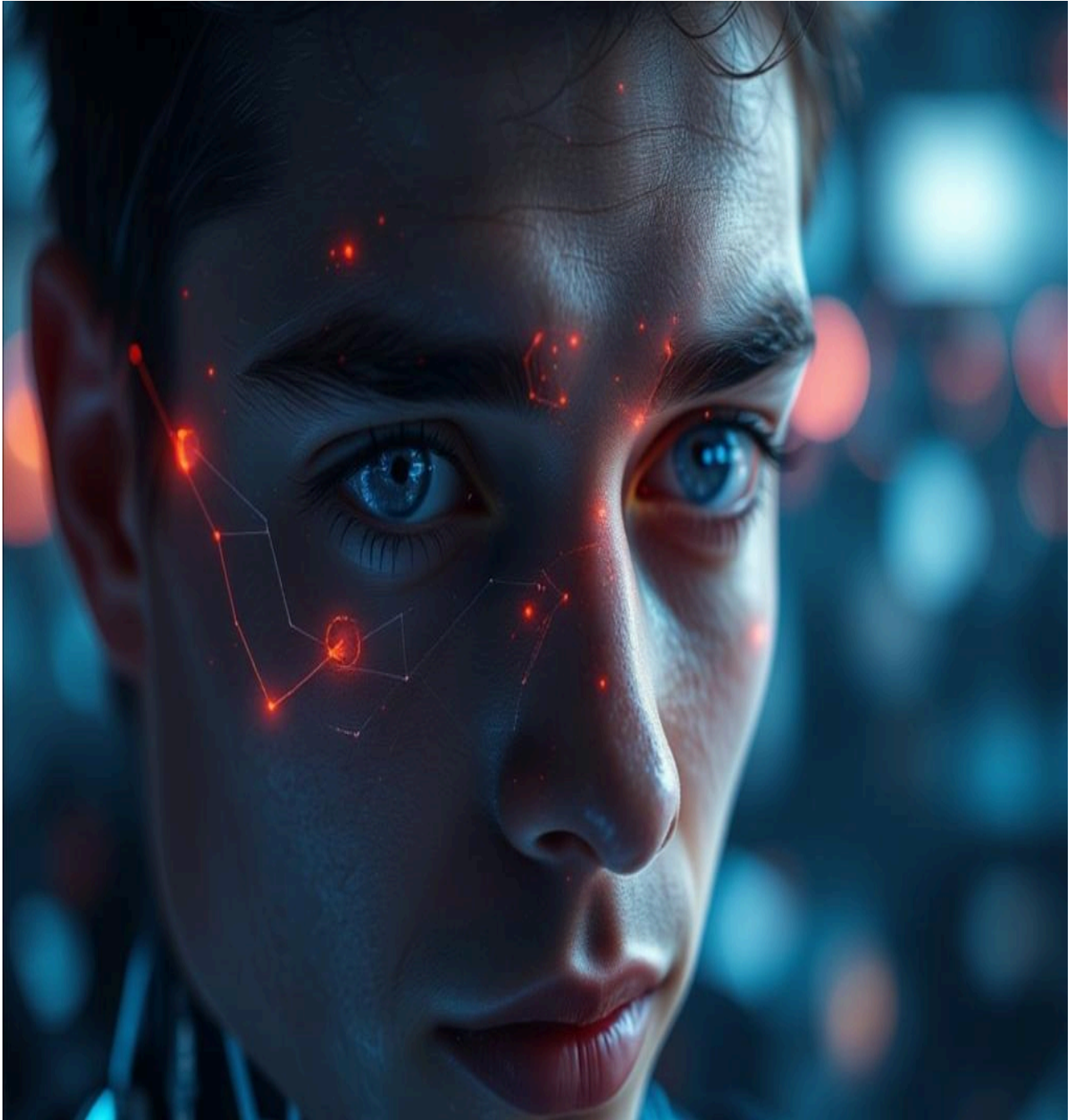
